



The Allegheny County Library Association provides and promotes public library service for all residents of Allegheny County. The association's youth services program provides resources for libraries to share with children and families in their communities. These resources create awareness of the public library, promote the importance of reading and offer guidance to parents about early literacy skills and kindergarten readiness. In 2022, ACLA began providing libraries with StoryWalks, children's books placed page-by-page along a walking path in a park or other public space. The program encourages screen-free outdoor exploration and promotes early literacy. Funds would help create more StoryWalks, including adding bilingual titles to the collection and collaborating with local nature partners.

Arcade Comedy Theater works to elevate and advance the art of comedy with performances and educational offerings for audiences in Pittsburgh and beyond. Now in its 10th year, the theater has built a community of comedic artists who perform for thousands of area residents in more than 300 shows each year in its Downtown Pittsburgh theater space. The production value sets Arcade apart from other comedy theaters of its size around the country and gives audiences and performers alike a next-level experience at every show. As the theater begins its second decade, much of the production equipment that has served the art so well must be updated, upgraded or replaced. Funds would help rehaul production equipment in performance spaces.

Artists and Craftsmen's Guild Inc. / North Hills Art Center

Arkhaios educates people about diverse cultures from around the globe through a juried selection of the world's best documentary films about cultural history and archaeology. Under the visionary leadership of Jean Guilleux, the organization has curated ten annual, award-winning film festivals in Pittsburgh, South Carolina and online. This has been accomplished through 20,000 hours of personal volunteer labor by Guilleux and the support of 100 expert volunteers from the archaeology, anthropology, documentary film and education fields. Guilleux has led Arkhaios as a labor of love in his retirement years, but for the organization's future to be secured, the board would use funds to hire its first paid staff.

The North Hills Art Center promotes and encourages art education and appreciation for artists of all ages, focusing on art as a healing process. The organization is growing and requires a third part-time staff member to handle the administrative workload. The tight labor market has made it difficult to hire new employees with the required skill sets at the rate the center currently pays. Funds would support this critical component of the organization. It would allow the center to smoothly transition staff and maintain the high-quality art and healing offerings that serve the community.

Autumn House Press is an independent Pittsburgh literary publisher that seeks to publish and promote poetry and other fine literature. The women-led organization plans to publish eight poetry, fiction and nonfiction collections in 2024. The organization plans to publish local poet Cameron Barnett's second poetry collection, "Murmur." The Press published Cameron's first collection, "The Drowning Boy's Guide to Water" in 2018. "Murmur" is a powerful book that traces a Black man's lineage in contemporary America, showcases Cameron's creative growth and will be an important step in furthering his career. The organization's printing costs have increased a staggering 52% per book since 2021, forcing it to reduce print runs and redirect funds for promotional efforts. By supporting "Murmur," the Press will have greater sustainability and be better able to support and publish writers like Cameron.

The Battle of Homestead Foundation preserves and promotes a people's history of the 1892 labor conflict in Homestead. It strives to connect how knowledge of that event informs current social justice movements, empowers today's workforce and builds equitable and inclusive strategies for the future of work. The foundation seeks operating funds to create The Center for the History and Future of Work – a living history museum and public teaching forum that would use lessons from western Pennsylvania's industrial heritage to address challenges of equity, diversity and fair labor practice. The foundation hopes the center will be of particular economic benefit for Steel Valley communities, where many residents and businesses still maintain strong ties to the early labor movement and its legacy of social reform and economic change.

B.F. Jones Memorial Library provides equitable access to materials and programs that promote education, enrichment and social support for community members and visitors. The Library strives to create dynamic outreach programs for all ages. A key effort is the Traveling Tales outreach program, which provides local early child care centers with weekly story times, rotating book collections and various literacy materials. The nine child care centers included in this program serve families from underrepresented communities. This is often the only interaction many will have with the library. To keep the program strong and maintain a high-quality program facilitator, the organization would use funds to support the facilitator's salary.

Bushy Run Battlefield Heritage Society preserves and interprets 1763 Pontiac's War battle site through a museum, educational programs and community outreach. As Pennsylvania's only recognized Native American battlefield, the organization is interested in expanding programs to teach about Indigenous perspectives of the 1763 battle, the conditions leading up to it and the socio-political impact on North America. The society pays the salary of one staff member with funds generated by membership. Funds would be used to deliver low-cost or free educational programming to new visitors, broaden the scope of the organization's historical perspective for all Pennsylvanians and develop an annual history day camp to teach children history through a series of fun, skills-building activities.

Contemporary Craft engages the public in creative experiences through exhibitions, classes, community programming and a retail store. Contemporary Craft's innovative exhibitions focus on artistic excellence and explore issues related to contemporary life, including social justice topics ranging from mental health to climate change. The organization believes in compensating artists for the work they do including participating in residencies, teaching workshops and leading free and family-friendly activities during quarterly Community Days. Contemporary Craft's free admission policy provides essential experiences with art to individuals and families. The organization seeks funding to assist in providing arts programming to the general public and help maintain three studio spaces, where consumable materials and tools require regular servicing and upkeep.

Creative Citizen Studios helps artists with intellectual and developmental disabilities make, exhibit and sell their art.

It seeks funds to set up its new dedicated studio space at the Ice House in Lawrenceville with fixtures and equipment that would create a learning environment designed for disabled artists' specific needs. These include a mobile printmaking station that would expand in-house screen-printing capabilities, ergonomic storage solutions that would prioritize safety, and access to materials and digital tools for its Procreate digital drawing class. Its accommodations would include adjustable-height tables that better serve artists who use wheelchairs. Such modifications would reduce barriers to arts education for disabled adults.

Group empowers students through education, engagement and motion while instilling social and emotional learning skills that help students thrive physically, mentally, socially and emotionally. Its programs span from pre-K through college-age youth and encompasses a diverse curriculum that challenges students to grow. The organization uses music and movement to motivate students to become better teammates, strengthen their social skills, connect with community, heighten their self-esteem, foster leadership, communicate effectively, use proper etiquette and develop respect for themselves and others. The COVID-19 pandemic resulted in a huge deficit in self-regulation, communication, respect, social skills and self-esteem throughout schools in Allegheny County. Funds would help the organization expand, bring new schools on board and acquire equipment.

The Filipino American Association of Pittsburgh works to preserve and promote Filipino heritage in the community through cultural, charitable and educational activities. The association provides a free year-long dance program that reflects the breadth and depth of Philippine culture and history. The dance program encompasses the animistic beliefs of the many mountain tribes, Muslim and Christian beliefs, and celebrations of Spanish-influenced fiestas. Funds would help expand the association's repertoire, support instructors, and acquire new costumes, props and instruments. Funds would also cover stage rentals, professional fees for master classes and stipends for guest instructors.

Events showcase and promote international independent filmmakers, exposing the region to a creative community of artists and their thought-provoking work. Funds would support ReelAbilities Pittsburgh, which showcases the lives and talents of people with disabilities; Teen Screen, a free educational experience that allows students of different backgrounds to explore important and difficult topics through film; and the Filmmaker Conference, which educates local and international filmmakers and provides access to industry professionals.

Gemini Theater Company works to cultivate creativity, imagination and originality through the performing arts. The theater company strives to support an increasing number of patrons with neurodivergence, intellectual disabilities or other conditions that can make going to the theater difficult. Funds would help the theater create an atmosphere that is appropriate for audience members who experience sensitivities or negative reactions to sounds. The theater funds would help with costs to hire an American Sign Language interpreter for more performances throughout the season as well as a second interpreter for a more enhanced, professional experience. Funds would also be used to repair or replace speakers in the theater space, improve quality of sound and support the ability to program and adjust the music and sound effects in shows.

Genesis Collective works to build community through the arts, amplifying the creative voices of underserved and under-resourced people in Beaver County. The collective serves as a "midwife" for artistic vision and amplifies the voices of communities that do not typically have a say in places of power. The collective wants to stay agile to facilitate opportunities for collaboration, support educational needs or commissions. Funds would help strengthen the collective and help avoid depleting a reserve for organizational expenses. Funds would allow the collective to meet the increased demand for support of artists.

The Industrial Arts Workshop works to empower Pittsburgh-area youth and adults at the intersection of arts, community development and workforce readiness. The workshop has two core training programs, Summer Welding Bootcamp and the After School Welding Lab. The programs use art to teach high school students technical skills in a supportive environment that requires them to work collaboratively, respect others' opinions and gain self-confidence. Students learn about possible career pathways and ongoing training opportunities through field trips and guest speakers. Funds would help youth thrive through the creative process of teaching hands-on sculpture design and welding. The workshop hopes to build career pipelines for youth and young adults in the region, and funding would help boost engagement by increasing needed capacity and staff.

The organization offers music lessons, art workshops, dance classes and theater programs. As it continues to grow and expand its reach, general operating support is critical to sustain day-to-day operations. Funds would allow the academy to retain highly qualified and passionate instructors, invest in essential administrative personnel and provide the necessary resources to foster artistic excellence through affordable and accessible arts programs.

The organization aims to empower artist-caregivers and shift culture to value caregiving as an occupation. The organization curates artwork and explores the intricate aspects of motherhood, caregiving and parenting. Funds would help create a more inclusive platform with a more interactive website and services including American Sign Language interpreters and image descriptions on its website.

Write Pittsburgh is a program collective that works to amplify voices, empower writers, encourage relationships that build writer agency and foster relationships that strengthen community. Write Pittsburgh is driven by the belief that voices matter, that art makes a difference and that the human creature thrives on opportunities for self-expression, healing and community connection. The organization has grown steadily since it first gathered a small group of teen girls around a table in 2016. Now, it offers three free weekly workshops for teen writers, a teen council and workshops for adult writers. Funds would be put toward the costs of hiring a full-time executive director and program director to help continue to amplify voices and create community among writers.

412 Thrive provides a community-based support system to help individuals impacted by breast cancer navigate treatment and life. The organization seeks to make self-care accessible for individuals impacted by breast cancer at all stages. Since it was founded in 2020, the community has grown from 10 to more than 500 individuals. It offers a free, weekend-long camp experience annually in September designed to help improve the overall well-being of its "thrivers." The Wellness Retreat held at Camp T. Frank Soles includes personal development, wellness and mindfulness workshops as well as classic overnight camp activities with the goal of campers leaving with self-confidence and knowledge to advocate for care and resources. Funds would cover the costs of the retreat, including all lodging, meals and programming.

A Peace of Mind Inc. works to bridge the gap between inequities in the human service industry, focusing on holistically meeting community needs. The organization offers a developmentally relevant curriculum, experienced staff and out-of-the-classroom engagement opportunities for staff and families. The organization believes that educators can offer their best selves for families when they are well. In turn, families will show up as their best selves for the community. Funds would send two educators back to the classroom for two semesters with resources. They would receive a textbook stipend, travel voucher and a study reimbursement allotment to maintain pay while enrolled in a higher education program.

The organization provides basic needs support, including food, utility, housing and emergency assistance. The group provides home visits and hosts community fellowships so that people in the community can find emotional and social support from those around them. Abiding Missions also offers daily youth programs to help young people learn about the world around them, experience new things and learn how they can be leaders in their community. As programs continue to grow, especially the basic needs services and youth programs, funds would allow the organization to expand programs and ensure that no neighbor is in need.

Aliquippa Green empowers residents of Aliquippa to become productive citizens through educational programming for youth and young adults. The organization wants to build capacity and improve the infrastructure of the classroom building. Adding another teacher to the team would significantly increase the number of workshops that could be held and the number of students who could participate in programs. Funds would be used to purchase furnishings to make the classroom comfortable and accessible to all students and expand another classroom as a maker space for students and community members.

All About The Youth Community Center works to help Black, disadvantaged and at-risk youth focus on their future, academically change their trajectory and become successful in life. The organization seeks to fill a need for reading and math tutoring for 25 Black and disadvantaged youth. Currently, the organization's executive director facilitates all mentoring and tutoring. Funds would be used to hire staff, including math and reading specialists, to meet the needs of the youth they serve in Pittsburgh Public Schools and other Allegheny and Beaver County public school districts.

Apraxia Kids works to strengthen the support systems for children with childhood apraxia of speech through education, community outreach, advocacy and research. Many families in Allegheny County struggle to receive an accurate diagnosis or even adequate treatment as information of childhood apraxia of speech is limited. It is estimated that one in a 1000 children are impacted with nearly 250 children having apraxia in Allegheny County. Apraxia Kids provides education and resources for free and has the potential to reach all families in Allegheny County in need of specialized services. Funds would help the organization expand across the county to reach those struggling with apraxia and provide education and resources for early intervention, schools and speech-language pathologists.

The Bhutanese Community Association of Pittsburgh works to ensure a high quality of life for all members of the Bhutanese community. It supports their integration into American society through culturally informed services and activities. In its eleventh year of service, the Association serves as the premier resource for the local Bhutanese community. Programs include English as a Second Language, civics education training, voter engagement, domestic violence support, women's empowerment and celebrations of Bhutanese culture. The organization seeks to support the increased needs of the elderly Bhutanese population with activities that include yoga, meditation, educational site visits and walks in the park. Funds would pay for a part-time program facilitator and transportation to help the oldest members of the Bhutanese community to thrive.

Big Brothers Big Sisters of the Laurel Region creates and supports one-on-one mentoring relationships to ignite the power and promise of youth. Caseworkers screen and train volunteer mentors in youth development using social justice and trauma-informed practices. The mentoring pairs' time spent together provides the child with opportunities for exploration, creativity, learning and meaningful connections with caring adults. The vital adult guidance and resources change the life trajectory of participating kids, helping ignite and harness their potential and leading to increased social, emotional and educational successes. Funding enables caseworkers to provide tangible items and referrals to meet the mentee and family's needs, such as food, shelter and counseling services. Funds would help the mentoring pair access low-cost activities centered around individualized goals.

Braddock Trail Chapter, National Society Daughters of the Revolution is a volunteer service organization that promotes historic preservation, education and patriotism. The organization has owned and operated the historic Samuel Warden mansion in Mount Pleasant since the 1960s. Braddock Trail is one of only two chapters to own and operate a chapter house in western Pennsylvania and the only chapter in the state to operate a Genealogical Research Library open to the public. Members are mostly senior citizens and with the increased cost of living, the board is reluctant to increase membership dues. Funds would supplement operating income to continue to pay ever-increasing annual expenses.

Sonward's founding director and her family live in the community and "do life" with the families who participate, providing relational support alongside the professional services supporting the families. Funds would support the pay of teen staffers to meet their financial needs and develop them into good citizens.

As disabled people are underserved and extremely stressed in prison, ACHIEVA's Autism Connection of Pennsylvania is a lifeline and central hub for families and adults to provide autism support, information and advocacy. About a quarter of the U.S. prison population has a developmental disability. When justice entanglement occurs, families are devastated. They suddenly lose control, feeling lost and hopeless. The organization aims to reach in, listen to, support and amplify the voices of those incarcerated. Funds would help increase support group offerings and build an understanding community for families of those incarcerated. Funds would help expand the first-in-the-nation support group for families of incarcerated people with disabilities.




Amachi Pittsburgh works to empower those most vulnerable to the criminal justice system by supporting youth and families impacted by parental incarceration. These youth, with a sixfold risk of becoming incarcerated themselves, grapple with intersecting marginalization, navigating racism and poverty. The organization offers one-on-one mentorship from compassionate adults and nurtures youth leadership to foster civic engagement. More than 90% of Amachi youth break free from the cycle of intergenerational incarceration. Funds would provide essential general operating support for Amachi Pittsburgh to continue its work with youth and families impacted by parental incarceration.

Arise Immigration Services provides pro bono legal services to immigrants in Pittsburgh and expands capacity around the county through its mentorship training model. It provides solutions to the injustices immigrants face with high-quality, pro bono legal services for immigrants with complex cases in Pittsburgh. The organization provides training and mentoring to other advocates with a model that reflects its philosophy that advocates learn best in community with others and with the support of a seasoned, savvy advocate. The demand for services has never been higher. Since launching in early 2023, Arise has provided legal representation to Afghan asylum-seekers in Pittsburgh. These clients served alongside the U.S., which placed them at great risk when the U.S. withdrew from Afghanistan. Funds would help the organization expand services to train more advocates and serve more asylum-seekers in Pittsburgh.

YogaRoots On Location builds community through anti-racist and social justice-based Raja Yoga to courageously and vulnerably explore hearts, histories and action through collective healing. The organization wishes for scholarship funds for Pittsburghers of the Global Majority and those facing systemic financial barriers to pursuing the organization's 200-hour Anti Racist and Social Justice Raja Yoga Teacher Training. Its anti-oppression model means no one is denied access due to resource inequity. The yearlong training cultivates civic stewardship by integrating systems-based and trauma-informed frameworks. Doing so strengthens democracy by curating a diverse community of highly skilled intergenerational change makers. Trainees focus on self and community care to address school, work and life burnout to support the community's quality of life. The organization teaches Raja Yoga as a pathway to sustain anti-oppression work while centering Blackness and collective liberation rooted in unconditional love.

Highlands Partnership Network works to build belonging and pride by connecting people to resources that impact and transform lives. The grassroots volunteer effort of nonprofit organizations, faith-based organizations, elected officials and resident stakeholders collaborates monthly to identify challenges, barriers and the lack of resources in the Highlands School District communities of Tarentum, Fawn, Brackenridge and Harrison Township. 


Animal Protectors of Allegheny Valley rescues, rehabilitates and re-homes stray, injured, abused and abandoned dogs and cats in the Alle-Kiski Valley. The no-kill shelter seeks to expand the concrete pads outside the doors leading to the dogs' play yards. During inclement weather, the mud gathers in the entryway, and the dogs and handlers track it into the building. The dogs then need to be bathed and the staff must clean the floors so that no one slips and falls. This takes time that could be spent walking the dogs or engaging them in behavior training, readying them for adoption.

Battles to Bikes provides free bicycles and two-wheeled recreational therapy to local veterans in need. The organization seeks to secure three more bicycle packages for local veterans. Packages include a bicycle, helmet, gloves and tool kit. Since the program's inception in 2021, recognition has grown about the magnitude of recreational, mental, physical and emotional needs of veterans suffering from post-traumatic stress disorder. Enjoying outdoor cycling, with or without others, is therapeutic for many. To spread that positive influence even further, the organization requests funding to provide three more bicycle packages.

Casino Theater Restoration and Management works to restore and maintain the historic Casino Theater located in Vandergrift. Vandergrift was a steel mining town founded in 1900 to be "something better than the best" by George McMurtry. On military holidays, the veteran's memorial on the theater grounds serves as a stage for ceremonies and the laying of wreaths honoring hometown soldiers. The memorial site includes plaques listing the names of local soldiers who served in U.S. conflicts through 1990 and special recognition of fallen heroes. Funds would be used to refurbish the memorial area to include seating for quiet reflection and add missing names and residents who served in conflicts since 1990.

Communicycle Beaver County connects people in need to others in their community to promote healthy activity and essential transportation by refurbishing, distributing and repairing bicycles at no cost. In 2011 Communicycle opened in a low-cost, unheated building in Aliquippa, where volunteers fixed donated bikes for children. The group added Aliquippa neighborhood events to help those in poverty or in single-parent families who couldn't get to the shop, and eventually expanded to serve adults and other communities. This expansion required a year-round location and more bikes, supplies, tools, volunteers and room. The organization is negotiating a lease for a rental property, a space physically and geographically suitable and essential to growing its mission. Funds would help establish a central location for its outreach.

The Little Free Libraries would reach community members who may not otherwise visit the library and also help residents create personal libraries in homes that may lack literacy resources. Volunteers from The Friends of Whitehall Library would oversee the stands. Funding would support the Little Free Libraries and associated installation hardware.

As an Educational Training Authority under the PA State Fire Academy program, the Academy's programs are attended by first responders and industry agencies from various counties in southwestern Pennsylvania, including Indiana, Westmoreland, Armstrong and Allegheny. Funds would enable the Academy to continue to offer training to emergency services volunteers from the region at a reduced rate. With the ever-increasing costs of materials and supplies and increased costs for utilities and insurance, any funding received will allow the academy to provide training without impacting the students' agency budgets.






Both courses offer national certification upon successful completion and pay a living wage with career pathways.
